A BRIEF NOTE ON THE ORGANISERS

Manonmaniam Sundaranar University: Manonmaniam Sundaranar University (MSU) is a dynamic institution of higher learning, set in a rural milieu of southern Tamil Nadu, with a campus spread of 550 acres. The University is situated at Abishekapatti, 9 kms from Tirunelveli Junction. A judicious blend of functional and aesthetic features distinguishes the campus buildings. The University was established by the Government of Tamil Nadu as a teaching-cum-affiliating University on 7th September, 1990 to cater to the long-felt needs of the people of the four southern most districts of Tamil Nadu viz., Tirunelveli, Tenkasi, Tuticorin, and Kanyakumari. It is named after the renowned Tamil Poet scholar, Professor P. Sundaram Pillai (1855-1897), the author of the famous verse drama Manonmaniam. It is his poem that has become "Tamil ThaaiVazhthu" the official invocation song sung in all functions in Tamilnadu. The University, sensitive to the complex and diverse needs of the times, has evolved many innovative programmes. Research and extension activities are not pursued for its own sake, but are directed towards enriching the social matrix to help build better human beings and better tomorrow. Adequate infrastructure facilities and the peaceful campus atmosphere are conducive to the students to pursue their academic endeavours in an excellent manner. The University was re-accredited with 'A' by the NAAC and it has 27 Departments, 101 affiliated colleges and 6 constituent Mano colleges under it.

Guidelines for Submission

Format and Size:

- 1. The abstract of full paper should not be more than 150 words in a single paragraph with single spacing. Maximum five keywords are needed.
- Papers written in English should be in Microsoft Word format using Times New Roman, font size 12,1.5 line spacing and page size 18cm x 24cm (margin – 2.54 cm top/bottom and 2.54cm on left/right). Paper presenters in Tamil literature are asked to use Bamini font.
- 3. Full paper should not exceed more than 6 pages including the other required details.
- 4. The font size of the main title on the front page is 14.
- 5. Each word should be capitalized except prepositions/articles within the title, bold, and centered at the top of the first page.
- 6. All your articles and research papers must be free from plagiarism

Headings

- 1. Headings must be capitalized, bold, and left justified.
- 2. First letter of each word in sub-heading must be capitalized, bold, and left justified.
- 3. Use double space before and after paragraphs and headings.
- 4. Font size of the main heading and sub heading should be 12.

Tables/ Diagrams: Insert the table/ figure number inside the document and show the table/ figure along with the title at the document with the appropriate number.

Referencing

- 1. Reference must follow APA / MLA styles (Apply whichever is suitable).
- 2. All references should be at the end of the text in alphabetical order.

Conference Proceedings: All the conference papers received will be blind peer reviewed by competent reviewers. The selected conference papers will be published in a book with ISBN. The conference proceedings and certificate of presentation will be distributed to participants on the day of the conference itself.
